Gentlemen,

Your staff has advised us that the Agency seeks to participate in the questioning of certain enemy combatants detained in the recapture mission of individuals affiliated with classified project "Greenleaf." Such action by the Agency has been deemed critical to the U.S. Government intelligence community as well as the safety of American civilians.

Your science and research M-Division has had extraordinary - indeed, unprecedented in the annals of American history - access to many of the Nation's most sensitive scientific secrets [CIA case files: 2R-09, 4K-34, 5Q-93, 6X-11]. Your findings from supplemental examination and unbiased review of these projects with our respective functional departments has provided significant benefit to the U.S. Government's arsenal of proprietary weapons and has increased its ability to safeguard its leaders and populace.

As the officers of the United States responsible for the law enforcement, defense, and intelligence functions of the Government, we request your Agency to proceed in the investigative manner previously discussed re: the questioning of detainees and the data collection of valuable information related to the Louisiana "Gill Girl" incident [CIA 7M-14].
